## **Office Procedures**

- Process telephone requests for burial intake
- Verify ownership and burial records
- Record burials and locations
- Complete Purchase Agreement & Memorialization Forms
- Maintain maps and lot books
- Data entry
- Assist family and friends in locating grave(s)
- Follow up on incomplete information
- Accounting
- Submit burial permits
- Complete Service Request Forms and follow up
- Provide bereavement support information

## **Preparing The Grave**

- Layout and cross check grave location
- Draw grave diagram, mark grave
- Truck equipment and tools to gravesite
- Break through frost in winter
- Excavate grave and remove excess dirt
- Dress the grave
- Assist vault company

## Preparing The Crypt & Niche

- Cross check crypt or niche location
- Remove crypt or niche front
- Clean and prepare crypt or niche area
- Dress crypt or niche area
- Install crypt tray
- Seal crypt or niche front

#### Directing Interment Service

- Direct and escort funeral procession
- Assist with flowers
- Assist with casket
- Assist with vault cover
- Assist family

### Necessary Equipment & Materials

- Backhoe
- Dump truck
- Compressor
- Hand tools such as shovels, rakes and tape measure
- Planks and greens
- Casket cart and crypt lift
- Gasoline, propane and oil
- Grave warmers for winter burials
- Maintenance of all of the above equipment

#### Care After Burial Or Entombment

- Fill grave
- Removal of grave dressing including planks, greens, etc.
- Management of floral arrangements from funeral
- Sorting and cleaning
- Return equipment
- Removal of crypt lift
- Refill grave after settling
- Place top soil and seed grave
- Installation of memorialization
